

Anise Hyssop-perennial, leaves and flowers edible, use for salads, tea, flowers are a draw to pollinators.

Basil-Cardinal-tender annual-edible ornamental with showy flowers . Bees love it. Add it to your floral garden.

Basil-Genovese-tender annual, very aromatic, use to make pesto, add to Italian dishes

Basil-Lemon-tender annual-used in stir fry, salads, and sauces

Basil-Thai-tender annual-sliver and add to salads, great in stir fry and chicken dishes

Chamomile-annual but will re-seed...use in smoothies, desserts, dry blooms for tea

Chervil-annual-use in French cuisine, eggs, salads and soups

Chives-common-perennial-very popular herb, use fresh in salads, sandwich spreads, baked potatoes. Bees love their bloom.

Chives-garlic-perennial-use on vegetable and meat dishes that are complimented by garlic. Blooms are large and white and bees love them.

Lemon Balm-perennial, vigorous, use in fruit salads, teas,

Dill-annual, but will reseed-use with fish, vegetable dishes, dips, and for pickling, fragrant

Mint-Chocolate-vigorous perennial-need to control or plant in pots. Use in tea and hot chocolate.

Mint-Spearmint-vigorous perennial-need to control or plant in pots-use in fruit dishes and tea. Bees love mint blooms

Oregano-Common-perennial-good compliment to tomato dishes and sauces

Oregano-Greek-perennial-stronger aroma than common, but used in same way.

Parsley-biennial- great in potato or pasta salad, garnish

Rosemary-Nana- perennial, use in meat and veggie dishes

Rosemary-ARP,-perennial, use in veggie and meat dishes

Rosemary-tender-perennial but must be planted in pots, leave out in summer, bring in for winter

Sage, hardy perennial, will become large, use in poultry dishes and your Thanksgiving stuffing, great on baked potatoes too

Savory-winter-perennial-great in soups, stews and tomato sauces, dry for winter use.

Tarragon-Mexican-perennial-tall, yellow blooms that attract bees, used in Mexican and Southwest cuisine.

Thyme-fragrant perennial-use in Italian dishes, homemade tomato sauce

Thyme-English-grows taller but same used as thyme
