Opening Remarks Debra Kroon, President

Approval of Minutes from December 14, 2022 by Debra Kroon, PresidentNo discussion. Jenny Mansfield moved to except minutes. Beatrice Reiss seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer Report (reports sent via email) by Gilbert Plascencia, Treasurer – Gilbert brought extra paper copies. Points made were \$30,000 to Edward Jones. End of year ended good with Gilbert's \$30,000 Grant and Pat Bombard's \$5000 prize donation. Vanguard lost \$23,000 so we'll see what happens this year. Green House was depreciated \$14,600 for usage for another year. Deanna Husch moved to except report. John Strong seconded. Motion carried.

Greenhouse Lorie Harrison/Camille Smith/Skip Brockman Lorie researched soil trying to find a local source. The company is called Wapaca Northwest, it's in Parker. The cost per pallet is \$224.00 it has 50 bags at \$4.48 per bag of 1.5 cu ft. of loose soil. The Sunshine potting mix is 2.2 cu ft with compacted soil when fluffed up it's 4 cu ft at a coat of \$32.00 per bale.

The Wapaca soil is so much cheaper 3 bags = 4.5 cu ft at a cost of \$13.44 a savings of \$18.00 per bale. If we purchased 50 bales of Sunshine it would be \$1600.00 + tax. Wapaca 3 pallets of 50 bags = 225 cu ft @ \$224.00 a pallet = \$672.00 HUGE SAVINGS. Angela planted some plants to test drive.
